Mothers and Children First

ASAP, a new K of C pro-life initiative, encourages councils to step up support for young moms and children in need

In early June, Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly announced the ASAP (Aid and Support After Pregnancy) program, a new Orderwide initiative to strengthen K of C assistance for pregnancy resource centers and maternity homes.

Over the past two decades, such organizations have grown substantially in both number and in the services they provide, and Knights of Columbus councils are already strong allies with many of the more than 2,000 pregnancy resource centers in the United States. In addition to placing ultrasound machines in pregnancy resource centers through the Ultrasound Initiative — more than 1,550 since the flagship program launched in 2009 — Knights served more than 1.7 million volunteer hours and gave over \$18 million in funds and supplies to pregnancy centers and maternity homes from 2018 to 2021.

The new ASAP program, scheduled to launch July 1, will build on that support: For every \$500 that a council donates to a qualified pregnancy resource center or maternity home — up to \$2,000 in the 2021-22 fraternal year — the Supreme Council will add \$100, a 20% increase.

2022 BABY BOTTLE FUNDRAISER UPDATE

At this point, we have successfully collected \$8.2K, exceeding our goal of \$7.5K, which is our portion (25%) of the cost for a mid-range ultrasound device (about \$30K). These funds, together with matching funding from an organization called 4US and the national Knights of Columbus, will furnish a new ultrasound device for a pregnancy resource center called Next Step in Livermore (formerly Valley Pregnancy Center in Pleasanton). Following the recent selection of an ultrasound device by Next Step, on July 20th 4US issued a grant for their portion (25%) of the machine's cost. (See next page.) In addition, the application to Supreme for them to provide the remaining 50% was submitted to the State Deputy on July 26th for his signature and for forwarding to Supreme.

CALIFORNIA PROPOSITION 1 ON BALLOT IN NOVEMBER

This proposition would enshrine the most extreme forms of abortion into the state constitution. The California Catholic Conference vehemently opposes this proposition, which would solidify and protect abortion on demand up to the moment of birth, with no medical reason necessary, and supported by taxpayer funds. This measure would align California with only a handful of countries in the world, including China and North Korea, rather than the vast majority of western democracies which do not allow elective late-term abortions.




A Call to Serve
