One cannot forget the experiences of our youth during this magical time of the year. The smells of homemade baking of candy and cookies, enjoying the sights (Caroling, parties) and the sound of Christmas music. The fire in the fireplace and putting up Christmas decorations, tree and shopping for loved ones. All reflections of Christmas' past and anticipation and excitement for the future. Our Church also transforms with Advent Wreaths, Giving Trees, exciting Liturgical readings, Manger scenes and Music that stirs up memories long forgotten. Are you fully prepared for Advent? It's a time to be formed and transformed, a time to be ourselves, sometimes child-like (needy, innocent, trusting and full of unconditional love). Advent is a time for preparation focusing on the final coming of Our Lord in glory and the incarnation of Our Lord in the Birth of Jesus. During Advent, you will receive a daily email with the Gospel reading, and a corresponding reflection and prayer. The reflections and prayers are written by students, faculty, staff, board members, alumni of the Jesuit School of Theology, and other members of the Santa Clara University community. May these beautiful reflections deepen your experience of Advent and Christmas.

Consider these daily emails as an invitation to a retreat experience. Find some quiet in your day to contemplate the readings and the accompanying reflection. Let the reflection inspire your own praying and thinking. Ultimately, Advent is a time to grow in our knowledge of God's love for us in Christ, and notice our response to this love in our daily lives.

At JST, we pay attention to the situation of our world and our communities as we study and minister to others. If the Spirit moves you, bring the very ordinary routines of daily life into your own prayerful reflections by asking yourself, "What is God trying to share with me at this moment?"

We take this journey through Advent in supportive companionship. First of all, the Lord walks with each of us, relating to us uniquely and offering us divine friendship. Moreover, as we make this retreat together, thousands of people in the wider Santa Clara community unite through a common desire to grow in faith, hope, and love. You might wish to reach out to friends to share your experiences and invite them to join you on this retreat (share this link). Or, you might journal about what you are experiencing and learning.

St. Ignatius of Loyola taught that generosity is the most important spiritual disposition for our prayer life. Generosity is a largeness of heart that is open to God's creativity in our lives. Registering for this online retreat underscores the generosity of spirit and time that you now offer to God and to those on this pilgrim journey with us.
