Knights of Columbus Free Throw Shooting Contest

The annual Knights of Columbus Free Throw Shooting contest will be held virtually this year. To compete please read the instructions and submit no later than February 9th to Mark Worrell mworrell@sbcglobal.net.

Knights of Columbus California State Council 2021 Council Level Free Throw Competition

Submissions must be received by end of day February 9th, 2021

The 2021 Knights of Columbus Free Throw competition provides a fun athletic outlet for young people ages 9 to 14 (their age as on Jan. 1^{st} 2021) and encourages the values of sportsmanship and healthy competition. As a result of the Covid-19 restrictions, the State Council has made adjustments for how the free throw competition will be run this year. Please see the instructions below.

Instructions for Remote Council Level Free-Throw Competition

- 1. Parents and legal custodians are encouraged to locate a basketball court to record their child's free throw competition attempts in a safe manner, socially distanced from others. The competitions will be done solo this year, not in a group setting and are required to be recorded.
- 2. The basketball hoop used for the free throws can be in a park, or schoolyard with a basketball hoop.
- 3. Please adhere to the hoop height, distance and if possible ball size specifications. We want as much participation as possible!
- 4. Participants are encouraged to practice beforehand, but to ensure fairness, parents/or responsible adult should video record and submit only ONE official attempt.
- 5. The parent/adult will fill out the scorecard after videoing, attest to the accuracy of the score by signature and submit by email the filled out, verified score card and video file to our council email address: event@kofc6043.org
- 6. Please name the video file in the following format, our council # (6043) dot child's last name dot child's first name dot -gender dot -age (as of Jan 1, 2021) dot # of successful baskets, e.g. 6043.Smith.Tiffany.F.11.13
- 7. Ages 9, 10, 11 (as of Jan 1, 2021) (Boys & girls competitions) are recommend to use a women's regulation-size basketball and shoot from a 12-foot foul line (although they can shoot from the 15 foot line but all shots must be taken from the same location) at a 10-foot-high basket.(note: the normal foul line is 15 feet from the basket).
- 8. Ages 12, 13, 14 (as of Jan 1, 2021) (girls competitions) are recommended to use a women's regulation-size basketball and shoot from the regulation foul line 15 feet and a 10-foot-high basket.
- 9. Ages: 12, 13, 14 (as of Jan 1, 2021) (Boys competitions) are recommended to use a men's regulation-size basketball and shoot from the regulation foul line 15 feet and a 10-foot-high basket.
- 10. After a short practice, each contestant shoots 15 consecutive free throw attempts from the appropriate age-designated foul line. The attending parent/responsible adult videos the attempts. The parent/adult marks an X on the scorecard on attempts where baskets were made and a 0 on baskets missed and then writes the total baskets made in the proper column on the score card. The parent/adult then signs the card. The parent/custodian scans or takes a photo of the scorecard and emails it to our Knights email address: event@kofc6043.org along with the properly named video file: 6043.Smith.Tiffany.F.11.13 by end of day February 9th, 2021.

We continue to pray for an end to this pandemic, while we continue to adapt ourselves to it by modifying our means of continuing meetings, events and programs. We continue to encourage your support and participation in our upcoming activities.

PGK SK Mark Kotch Suffers Double Loss




