From the Council Faith Director **God is Faithful!** **J.M.J.**

I firmly believe that God has allowed for us to witness "Saints in the making". Yes, Saints living among us, even to the point that they worship God with us, in our very presence. - 6) making the Lord the main Desire of our hearts (Mt 5:8),
- 7) making peace by shedding our own blood rather than that of our enemies (see Mt 5:9; Heb 12:4; Col 1:20), and
- 8) being persecuted, insulted, and slandered as Jesus was (Mt 5:10-11).

The Sermon on the Mount, a start in Jesus' ministry starts the **formula**:

He began to teach them, saying:

Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

Blessed are they who mourn, for they will be comforted.

Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the land.

Blessed are they who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be satisfied.

Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy.

Blessed are the clean of heart, for they will see God.

Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God.

Blessed are they who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness,
for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

Blessed are you when they insult you and persecute you
and utter every kind of evil against you falsely because of me.

Rejoice and be glad,

for your reward will be great in heaven." Mt. 5: 1-12

ABORTION CLINICS OPENING IN OUR NEIGHBORHOODS

A few weeks ago, the FDA (Food & Drug Administration) issued a declaration permitting any pharmacy to begin selling an abortion pill also known as RU 486. There are three main drug pharmacies selling RU 486 which are listed below. I have written to my drug plan covered by CVS and I thought there may be several knights who think enough of this issue, to write as well. It is best when writing your own letter to put it in your words and thoughts but to help you I have provided some reflections and facts.

1. Initially when RU486 was passed by the FDA, a doctor had to write a prescription and the woman could only take it within her first trimester. How can this be determined accurately and safely at store level?
2. RU 486 is dangerous. Over 100 pregnant women have died after taking this drug usually from excessive bleeding including one young woman from Livermore a few years ago.
3. Children are a gift of life and mankind is made in the image of its Creator. Wouldn't (name of drug company) be then involved in the killing of innocent life?
4. If your drug plan is covered by one of the three companies shown below, changing your drug plan now is not an option. You can only do it once /year and this window has already passed but please consider this next October when the window will open for two plus months.
5. Suggested ending: "Please consider these thoughts and please change the direction of your company."

AT THE START OF A NEW YEAR

A NOTE FROM FR. MARK

Ten Questions To Ask At The Start Of A New Year

Happy Epiphany of the Lord! On this day we celebrate that Christ is revealed as being for all people. The magi, whose story we hear, are in the vanguard of all who are not Jewish, and yet who God loves, saves and calls to himself.

During my homily last weekend, on the Solemnity of Mary the Mother of God, I pointed out how St. Luke in his gospel tells us Mary “kept all these things, reflecting upon them in her heart,” and that the beginning of the New Year is an ideal time to do some reflecting ourselves. I shared 10 questions for reflection, hoping one of them would land in your heart, for you to keep and reflect upon. After Masses last weekend, many of you asked if I could provide the questions in written form. I gladly do so. As I mentioned, these questions were put together by author and Professor Don Whitney, founder of The Center for Biblical Study. I hope you find them of value.

1. What is one thing you could do this New Year to increase your enjoyment of God?
2. What is the most humanly impossible thing you will ask God to do this year?
3. What is the single most important thing you could do to improve the quality of your family life this year?
4. In which spiritual discipline (e.g. prayer, spiritual reading, silence, study, fasting, almsgiving, worship, confession, chastity, proper use of material things, etc.) do you most want to make progress this year, and what will you do about it?
5. What is the single biggest time-waster in your life, and what will you do about it this year?
6. What is the most helpful way you could strengthen your church?
7. For whose salvation will you pray most fervently this year?
8. What is the most important way you will, by God's grace, try to make this year different from last year?
9. What one thing could you do to improve your prayer life this year?
10. What single thing that you plan to do this year will matter most in ten years? In eternity?

Let us keep each other in prayer as we move into 2023. May we encounter the God who loves us in enjoyable, authentic, and life changing ways this New Year!

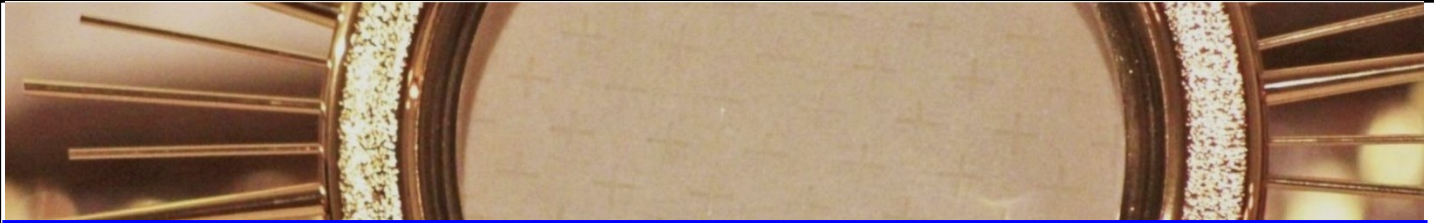
