We look forward to praying with you.



From our Worthy District Deputy

My brothers,

Today while visiting with brother Knights after SK Ed Rasmussen's funeral, I was struck by how many of our senior brothers (age 65+) have not been vaccinated even once. More than one brother mentioned that he was waiting to be called for an appointment. My brothers, DO NOT WAIT TO BE CALLED! Be proactive! Kaiser has been reported in the news as notoriously ineffective at vaccinating its members efficiently. Sutter Health has experienced a shortage of vaccine. There are other options!

YOU DO NOT HAVE TO WAIT TO BE CALLED! For example, while I am a member of Sutter Health, which has had difficulty obtaining vaccine, I also qualified to get vaccinated at Stanford ValleyCare in Pleasanton because I was a patient at ValleyCare Hospital in the past 3 years.

The information below was obtained from the City of Pleasanton. It has phone numbers and web links for you to make an appointment (65+) or to get notified when you become eligible. Even if you're not eligible to get the vaccine yet, I urge you to sign up for MyTurn (<u>myturn.ca.gov</u>). I signed up, and while I ended up getting vaccinated at ValleyCare, I did receive notifications about available appointments at various vaccination centers.

Alameda County Fairgrounds by appointment only

- <u>Sutter Health</u> patients **65+** and healthcare workers as defined by CDC can schedule an appointment <u>online</u> or by phone 844-987-6115.
- <u>Stanford Health Care patients</u>: **65+** and healthcare workers can schedule an appointment <u>online</u> or by phone (650) 498-9000 M-F, 8am-5pm.
- Alameda County: residents 65+ and health care workers who are not a patient of Sutter Health or Stanford Health Care can schedule an appointment <u>online</u>.

Oakland-Alameda Coliseum vaccine site is open by appointment for health care workers, persons **65+**, essential workers in food/agriculture, educators/childcare providers, emergency personnel by scheduling an appointment through the <u>MyTurn</u> scheduling system or calling 833-422-4255 M-F 8am-8pm; Sat/Sun 8am-5pm.

CVS: by appointment only for persons 65+, health care workers, and long-term care residents and staff can schedule an appointment <u>online</u>.

Rite Aid: by appointment only based on state and local jurisdiction eligibility can schedule an appointment <u>online</u>.

California launches new COVID-19 vaccine system. What Bay Area residents should know

The new system features a central site for all Californians to sign up for vaccination appointments

California on Monday launched <u>a new COVID-19 vaccine distribution system</u> operated by insurance giant Blue Shield of California, a shift that state officials say will speed up the rollout of doses and unify a county-by-county patchwork of eligibility standards.

But for Bay Area residents, it will take a few more weeks to notice any difference.

One glaring change is that the state's <u>My Turn online system</u>, which can be accessed at <u>myturn.ca.gov</u>, will serve as the central site for all Californians to sign up for vaccination appointments. Individual counties and health care providers will still play an essential role in immunizing people at their vaccination sites and mobile clinics, but the central booking system hopefully will make obtaining appointments more efficient and straight-forward.

Additionally, when the state decides to expand vaccination eligibility to the next category of the population whose turn comes up for doses, every county in the state will have to follow suit at the same time. Until now, county health officials have made their own call on when to provide vaccines to the next eligible category of people. ...










A Heart Renewed: Lenten Prayer
