God is Faithful!

" Thus the Lord used to speak to Moses face to face, as a man speaks to a friend." (Ex 33:11) Moses' prayer is characteristic of contemplative prayer with God by which God's servant remains faithful to his mission. Moses converses with God often and at length, climbing the mountain to hear and entreat him and coming down to the people to repeat the words of his God for their guidance. Moses is entrusted with all my house. With him I speak face to face, clearly, not in riddles," for Moses was very humble, more so than anyone else on the face of the earth." (Num 12:3, 7-8) Catechism 2576

Ten minutes a day in prayer! Wow, we have heard that before! I for one have to remind myself of this obligation, one I promised myself.

In Memory of PGK Ron Silva and his wife Nancy we are supporting a Coat Drive for the homeless in Hayward on Tuesday, November 22, 2022.

Event will take place at First United Methodist Church, 1183 B St, Hayward, CA 94541. For many years we collected used coats in good shape from friends and family of Knights and the Silva Family for this cause. Due to Covid, we have provided new coats for the past two years and will do so again this year. We are planning to return to donations next year.

To fund this event in Covid times we have relied on funding from our Council, donations from individual Knights and Melissa Silva/friends.

This year we are targeting donations of \$2,500 (\$2,275 received last year. Goal is to purchase a minimum of 50 to 60 good quality coats and McDonald's gift certificates for \$7.50.

There will be an Officers recommendation to be presented at the membership meeting for \$650 to help with this. This is the same amount as last year.

Individual Knight's contributions are \$600 to date.

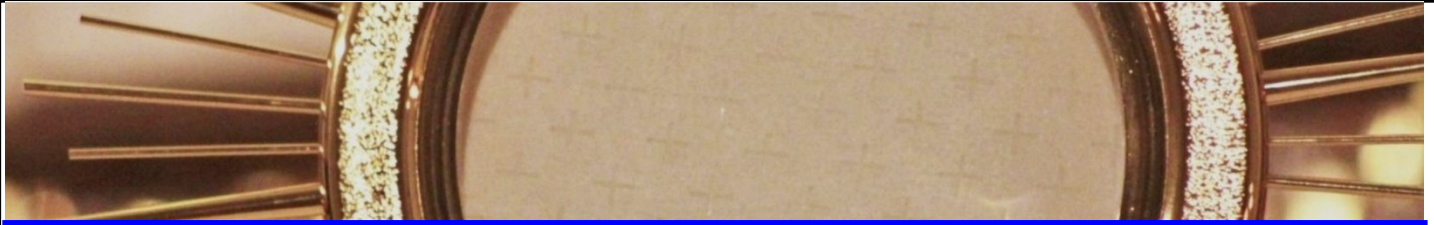
