A Priest Of 58 Years Reflects

February 20, 2020

Many are aware of who has caused the problems that we are facing in the Church today – Satan and his cohorts. But how many are aware of how he conned us into this crisis?

I believe that the strategy that he used pertains to our prayer life. I believe that he began his devious attacks on the Church by encouraging us to diminish our time in prayer.

As you may recall I was trained by the Benedictines in high school. I learned the motto of Saint Benedict – namely "Ora et Labora" – that is "Pray and Work". That is what he taught his followers. Both prayer and work are important practices – however prayer is more important than work.

After World War II, unofficially in France many of our religious men went to work in the factories – to be among their lay brothers and sisters. As a result, they altered by practice what St. Benedict had stressed. For them the motto of St. Benedict became "Labora et Ora" – that is "Work and Pray".

In 1961 I was ordained as a priest for the Archdiocese of San Francisco. I was assigned to minister in a parish in San Francisco. In 1962 I was assigned to

teach in a Catholic high school. During the early years of my priesthood, the motto of St Benedict was altered a second time – of course unofficially. Now it became “Work is Prayer.”

Because of this, many priests, especially at our Catholic high school accepted this teaching. As a result, we diminished our time in prayer. For we believed that since our school work is prayer, we no longer needed to pray as much. Many of us no longer prayed the Divine Office. Many even stopped praying the Rosary. Though we still offered Mass daily.

When Pope Paul VI promulgated “Humanae Vitae” in 1968 and two priests from the Archdiocese in Washington DC proclaimed that the Holy Father was wrong in his proclamation about the immorality of contraception, many priests rejected his teaching of this truth – including the majority of the priest teachers at my high school.

Why? Because – due to our diminished prayer life we had become spiritually blind. We could no longer recognize truth. That was the first effect of our diminished prayer life – the inability to recognize truth.

The second effect was that many no longer had the spiritual strength to resist temptations. Satan tempted us in our weak spots. And this resulted in our giving into sin. At the same time many denied that what we did was sinful.

The third effect of our diminished prayer life was that we saw the darkness within the Church and we were tempted to leave the priesthood. Many did – most of my priest friends did.

I did not. Why? Because a number of my lay brothers and sisters were praying for me. Their prayers spared me. I did not leave the priesthood.

Instead, I was graced to experience the blessings that God offered to the Church through the Catholic Charismatic Renewal.

The majority of the priests who taught with me left the priesthood – as did the majority of my classmates – who were ordained with me.

That happened as a result of our diminished prayer life.

What happened next was even worse. For Satan persuaded some other priests to remain in the priesthood – to teach our young people falsehoods – such as 1] one did not need to worship God on Sundays by going to Mass, and 2] it was ok to be sexually active without being married – with those of the opposite sex and/or of the same sex.

Today he is corrupting pre-adolescent youth through pornography on their cell phones and iPads and through various games, videos, and motion pictures.

Our youth today are not being taught the virtues – especially chastity. They are not being taught how to pray. They are not being taught how to resist their temptations. They are not being encouraged to go to confession frequently. That also is the work of the evil ones.

Michael, may God continue to guide you and help you to spread the Good News through your ministry.

Lent's journey is not a private experience. First of all, the Lord walks with each of us, relating to us uniquely and offering divine friendship. Moreover, we make this retreat together. Thousands of people in the wider Santa Clara community unite virtually with a common desire to grow in faith, hope, and love. You might wish to reach out to a friend to share your experiences through the weeks. Or you might journal about what you are experiencing and learning.

St. Ignatius of Loyola insisted that the most important spiritual disposition as we begin a retreat is generosity, a largeness of heart that is open to God's creativity and activity in our lives. Signing up for this online retreat underscores the generosity of spirit and time that you now offer.

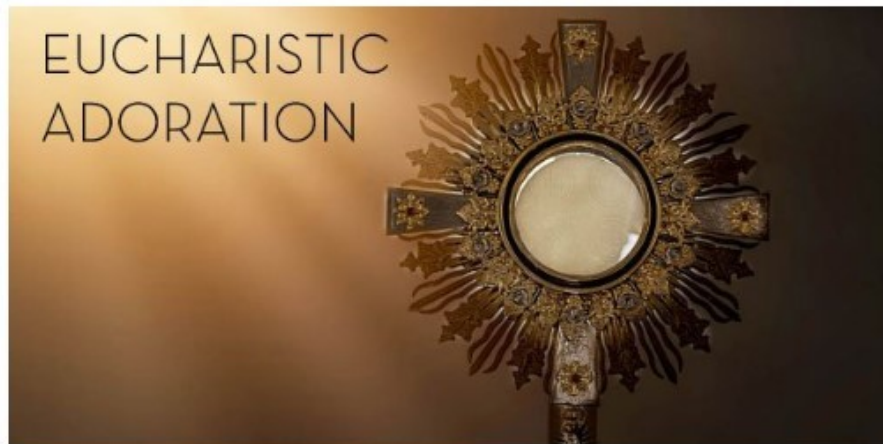
The Beginning To The End of Abortion

From the State Advocate



Brothers All...We are currently in a very important national and local election cycle. The Right to Vote is paramount to our Nations success. As you exercise your Constitutional Rights, it is important that you have the necessary Supreme Guidance and Policy regarding Political Activity and Social Media. I am providing you these important guidelines for your information and use. Here are the specific highlights:

Prohibition On Use Of Membership To Promote Candidates For Public Office: This guidance not only applies to supporting a specific candidate, it also applies to those who **ARE** running for political office. If you are running for office, I congratulate you. However, you must be very careful that you comply with the Laws of the Order. Failure to do so could lead us to take disciplinary action.

Guidelines for Political Activity: This document outlines the **Do's** and **Don'ts** as it concerns your efforts in exercising your Constitutional Rights. The **Do's** outlined are very inclusive and are straight forward. However, please pay close attention to the **Don'ts** listed. Especially note the last **Don't** listed which discusses social media and states: *"DO NOT use Knights of Columbus facilities, including, but not limited to, email accounts, social media, fax machines, letterhead and the like, in connection with partisan political activity."* There have been instances in the past where Brother Knights did not comply with these guidelines and had to be cautioned or disciplinary action taken.

Member Social Communications Policy and Guidelines: This policy is important in our daily activities as citizens and a member of the Knights of Columbus. This provides a clear and concise discourse of what you should follow. In the *Guidance for Members*, one of the sub-bullets states: *"Avoid making negative judgments about persons and organizations in connection with your membership in the Knights of Columbus. Avoid topics that may be considered objectionable or inflammatory – such as politics. Do not use ethnic slurs, personal insults, personal attacks, obscenity, or engage in any conduct unbecoming of a Catholic Gentleman."*

The above-mentioned documents are attached to the email message that distributes this Council Newsletter. Please take time to review them so you can be a stronger member of the Knights of Columbus. Go and Vote!

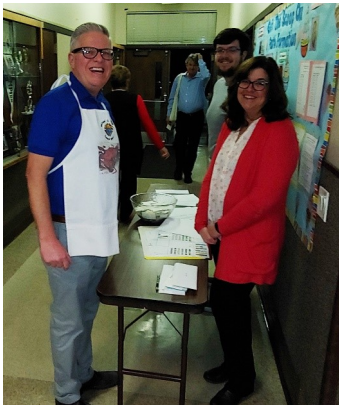


The Way Of The Cross

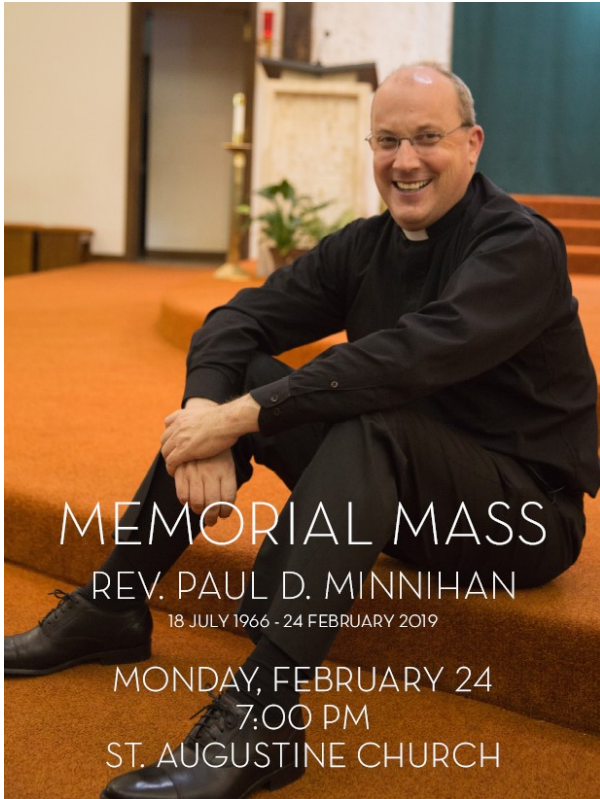

SECTION 1: PURPOSE

The Knights of Columbus Council #6043 will be awarding one or more \$1,000 dollar scholarships to area high school seniors who plan on attending a college or university following graduation. These scholarships are intended to assist children and family of members of Council 6043 to offset the cost of higher education so that students can work to achieve their academic and career goals.

SECTION 2: CRITERIA

Scholarships will be awarded to students based on the following criteria:

- The student must be enrolled in an accredited high school in the Tri-Valley community;
- The student must have a grade point average of 2.5 or better on a 4.0 scale;
- The student must submit the application and all required documentation by the stated deadline.
- Parent or Grandparent must be a current member in good standing with Council 6043

SECTION 3: REQUIRED DOCUMENTS & CHECKLIST

Completed submissions will contain the following four (4) documents:

1. A completed Knights of Columbus Council #6043 Application (this form) that is signed and submitted with the required documents (listed below);
2. In 250 words or less, please explain how this scholarship award will help you achieve your educational and career goals. Specifically, your essay should indicate what college or university you are planning to attend, what you plan to study, and what career path you have chosen.
3. One letter of recommendation from a teacher or school official (preferably on letterhead) that affirms your character.
4. A copy of your school transcript that shows your cumulative GPA (an unofficial copy is acceptable).

SECTION 4: DUE DATE & AWARD DISBURSEMENT

1. All scholarship materials must be submitted to the Grand Knight and postmarked or timestamped no later than 11:59 PM on April 30, 2020. Hardcopies can be mailed to: *K of C #6043*

2. All disbursements will be released to recipients after the council receives proof of enrollment.
