I look at our Council as the center of hospitality and welcoming wagon for our family & parish community. Origin of Michael J. Costello Council #6043

As told to Lou Santero by Bob Bodiford

John Banducci who was the insurance agent for the Knights of Columbus for this area in 1967 contacted Bob Bodiford at St. Raymond's Parish in Dublin to discuss the possibility of starting a council. With the reluctance of the pastor of St. Raymond's Church, who was Fr. Murphy at that time, Tom Thompson and Bob received permission and support from Fr. Murphy. Fr. Murphy was reluctant because of the existing Men's Club at the parish and he felt the Knights of Columbus might gain membership from the club and cause it to fold.

To form a council, at least 40 members are needed before being granted a charter. After several membership drives it became evident there was not enough interest at St. Raymonds to fill these numbers.

John Banducci gave Bob Bodiford Mike Costello's telephone number and Mike agreed to help. With Fr. Coultier's (pastor of St. Augustine's Church) permission members of this parish were recruited after Sunday masses by Mike and Bob. Both parishes were needed to fill the membership requirement for a new council. In March of 1968 a charter was granted to the John C. Mape Council #6043. The original name of our council was taken from the first Vietnam casualty from this area. A Navy pilot who was killed in action. In 1987, the council's name was changed to Michael J. Costello in honor of it's first Grand Knight. Listed below are the officers of the founding council:


