Grand Knight's Message

"The Son of Man did not come to be served; He came to serve" - Matthew 20:28 I don't know of another Bible passage that best describes the outpouring service that was present at the recently completed Crab Feed / Silent Auction event. Our Council continues to offer this event to our guests so that they can enjoy a wonderful socializing evening, but none of our good works would be possible without the tremendous support, commitment and participation from all our Worthy Brothers and Families. My sincere & heartfelt words of gratitude can not begin to express how thankful I am to each & everyone of you for all your unconditional contributions to make our 45th annual Crab Feed / Silent Auction event such a rousing success.

Our Council core-'ship' virtues (reflected within newsletter in puzzle format) are the cornerstone values that drive me and I believe makes our active Council vibrant. There was no greater evidence of our Brotherhood thriving in these core-ship characteristics then by the Brothers example of giving of their time & talents at our Crab Feed / Silent Auction gathering. All the months of preparation ensured a smooth and fun-filled event for the nearly 500 guests that attended our Council's hallmark event. I would be remiss not to recognize and greatly thank PGK Brad Schieferstein and Mark Kotch for their endless mentoring wisdom as we seamlessly transition to our new Crab Feed leadership team of PGK Tim Tuttle and Worthy Chancellor Paul Unpingco.

A great many Brothers stepped up to head the numerous groups needed to make an event of this magnitude a huge success. From the rapid fire floor/tables setup group (highlighted by Brother Bill Jorgensen dancing on the plastic floor covering), to the delicious cook/kitchen chef selections, all the energetic & smiling servers, and the high stakes Silent Auction group, it was the totality success of each of these member departments that led our Council to achieve record revenues that will help aid the numerous charities that depend on our donations. All proceeds from this event go to help local Charities which provide food, clothing, shelter, medical, spiritual healing and care for the dving.

I heard nothing but high praises from our guests about the great food (especially the steaks) & service they received, the outstanding raffle/silent auction items and about the wonderful fellowship & fun evening they enjoyed. Our Silent Auction event, moved inside a double room for the first time and under the guiding-tower direction of PGK Lou Santero, achieved record revenues as a result of the 124 assorted prizes (worth \$32,640 retail value) and having all but 13 of the items not bid on. I especially want to commend our numerous Worthy Brothers who contributed 12 prizes (ranging from a \$4,000 San Diego vacation home to \$30 for slightly used cowboy boots) that brought in over a third of all proceeds. Big or small, new or pre-owned, all of your contributions were welcomed and greatly appreciated.

Although it consumed the vast majority of our time, January was not just all about our keynote event. Worthy Deputy Grand Knight Stephen Natale & I attended the District Deputy Livermore meeting while Tom Smith & I represented the Knights at the Newcomer event at St. Augustine Hall. PGK Lou Santero, along with numerous other Brothers, attended the Walk for Life March in San Francisco. Lastly, I visited the Pleasanton School District Workability Department and the Dublin School of Imagination & Happy Talkers and presented each Director with our \$601.25 Intellectual Disabilities checks (Continued on next page)



from the Tootsie Roll campaign. Needless to say, both Directors were very thankful for our generous donations. While our Order provides charitable contributions to those less fortunate, we must also look at ourselves to insure we are well protected. Do you know that less than 30% of our membership are insured members (which leaves 70% uninsured!) through our local organization. All it takes to become an insured member is to invest \$100 in an annuity (for Knights with less than 1 year of service) or \$300 for an Knight with greater than a service year. These annuities have a guaranteed minimum annual interest rate for life and are but one insurance product available to us. Father Michael J. McGivney started the Knights in order to take care of others; please take the time to talk (510/754-1057), email (jeffrey.carvalho@kofc.org) and meet with our Worthy Field agent, Brother Jeffrey Carvalho, about any insurance program or financial matter you may have (be sure to inquire about your free gift).

Looking toward February, there are two events that I bring to your attention; the 4th Degree Exemplification and E -waste events. On February 1, a record 8 Council members have chosen to obtain their Fourth Degree classification. While many of us will be driving to Rohnert Park for this gala event, Brother Robert Strawn & his wife will be flying the friendly skies in their Cessna airplane to/from the ceremony. May God keep guiding our Order with our charitable acts that benefit the greater needs of our Council, Church, Community and Country.

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



District Deputy's Report

Brothers,

Congratulations on the charitable work you do. After a busy Christmas devoted to helping the less fortunate, all Councils in District 38 are conducting Crab Feeds to raise money for charity.

State Council

The semi-annual California District Deputy meeting was conducted the first weekend in January. Your Grand Knights and officers will hear the details at the District meeting. You can be proud of the State's officers.

The Worldwide Special Olympics are returning to the United States for the first time in 20 years. Twenty years ago the site was New Haven, Connecticut, the founding home of the Knights of Columbus. This July 2015 event will be in Los Angeles. Knights and their families will be asked to participate as translators, guides, cooks and event coordinators. We are receiving advance notice which demonstrates good solid management and planning. More details will be forth coming.

Chapter

The Oakland Chapter was awarded \$1,000 by the California State Council for first place in the Fall head to head chapter competition. Thank you for your efforts in making this win possible.

Two events were conducted at the end of last year. The first was a Casino excursion which sold out. The second was a concert by the University of the Philippines Choir after Christmas. Both these events netted the Chapter almost \$5,000. The good news is neither of these interfered with existing Council events. We can be thankful for Chapter President Noel Panlilio's efforts to put the Chapter on a sound financial footing.

District #38

The Council's in our District are functioning in the top tier. A measure by the State Council of on time reporting and recruiting has us ranked at the top. Each Council (Danville, Livermore Pleasanton, Dublin and San Ramon) are performing at a high level. All Brothers can be proud of the work your Council is doing. Success breeds success. While your events are excellent, more Catholic men want to join to be part of what you are producing.

Pope Francis

The Knights of Columbus Board of Directors had an audience with Pope Francis in October. The Pope received a gift of \$1.6M from the Vicarius Christi Fund's interest and earnings of the last year. The Vicarius Christi Fund was established by the Knights in 1981 to annually support the Popes' personal charities. Since inception, the fund's \$20M has generated over \$43.1M for charities of the Popes.

The following is a paragraph translated from Pope Francis' first speech, 'Urbi et Orbi'. Read how he feels on the pillars of our order. The highlighting is mine.

"And now, we take up this journey: Bishop and People. This journey of the Church of Rome which presides in **charity** over all the Churches. A journey of **fraternity**, of love, of **trust among us**. Let us always pray for one another. Let us pray for the whole world, that there may be a great spirit of **fraternity**. It is my hope for you that this journey of the Church, which we start today, and in which my Cardinal Vicar, here present, will assist me, will be fruitful for the evangelization of this most beautiful city."






