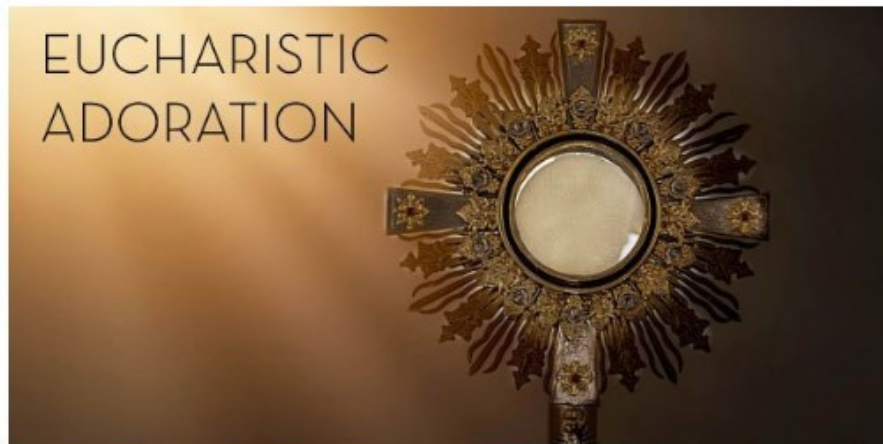

## 16<sup>th</sup> WALK FOR LIFE

As the picture indicates, a small group of Knights, their family members and parishioners left St. Augustine's church on Saturday, January 25th after attending and receiving a blessing from Mass.

Many people from within and out of the state attended and we experienced this outpouring right from the start. As our BART car contained a large contingent of teens and young adults from Stockton as well as a lone knight from Turlock.

We arrived in S.F. When the "silent no more" testimonies were already being spoken. These heart wrenching stories are very emotional and will bring tears to your eyes after witnessing the healing given to courageous women and men who tell their stories. They have often suffered for years with depression. Guilt, various addictions and often multiple abortions when seeking love in all the wrong places. I remember one woman's reply that she was already dead, just waiting to be buried.

Usually just the women come up to the stage to speak but this time we saw the whole family from Albuquerque arrive, both parents, their young daughter and three young sons. Years ago their unmarried daughter who was 16 weeks pregnant had endured a saline abortion. For those who are unfamiliar with this procedure, a doctor injects a saline solution through her stomach into the amniotic sack containing her baby. The baby is poisoned by swallowing the solution and his skin is completely burned away. After the baby dies the mother goes into labor somewhere between 12 and 24 hours after the injection and expels the dead baby.

Immediately after having gone through this procedure the daughter becomes distraught and regrets what she had done, she goes home and fearfully tells her mother what happened.

The mother does not respond in anger and tries to console her daughter. Mother brings her to a hospital the next day and doctors tell them there is nothing they can do to save the baby. She goes into labor purposely without pain medication as a way of trying to inflict punishment on herself. Throughout labor she is heard to repeatedly cry out "I'm sorry for what I did to you." She delivers her dead baby but her deliriums have stopped and she is no longer distraught, when asked how she has become so calm and peaceful, she responds "I have heard from my baby....." "I forgive you mommy"

At 12:30 pm the rally began featuring 3 main speakers. Fr. Frank Pavone of "priests for life" which incidentally was formed in S.F. He was a dynamic speaker and told us that positive changes were coming to curtail and eventually eliminate abortion laws at the federal level, encouraging us to continue to pray for and support our leaders in the Pro-Life movement. A moving story was told by Kathleen Folan, a family & youth director from St. Dominick's church in S.F. She spoke of carrying her baby to term after being raped at college and giving "Nathan" up for adoption. Kathleen and the adoptive parents agree to keep in touch with each other as he is growing up. Nathan is now a grown man and spoke after Kathleen expressing his thanks to her for giving birth to him and for continuing to be in his life. Finally, a speech from Reverend Childress from N.J. who always closes the rally with inspiring and motivational thoughts.

A drone was used to detect the number of people attending and while no count could be ascertained, the pictures indicated that it was the largest crowd to date approaching if not exceeding 50,000.

The walk began on time at 1:30 pm and was very orderly and peaceful. As the walk approached Powell street, we encountered the small pro-choice contingent permanently stationed on the sidewalk. They used their loud speakers to shout out their slogans while we responded in loud voice "Pro-Life"..... "Pro-Life"!

For those who haven't experienced the exhilaration and inspiration surrounding the walk for life, please consider to hold next year's date 1/23/21 open on your calendar and consider bringing your teenage children or grandkids to this important event.

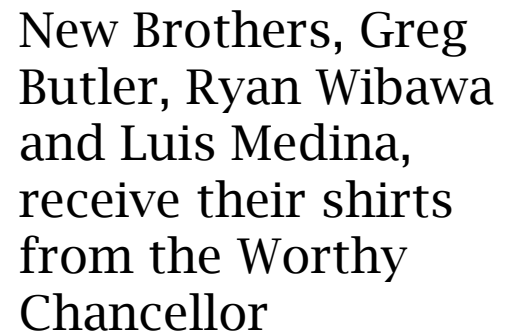
Special notes:

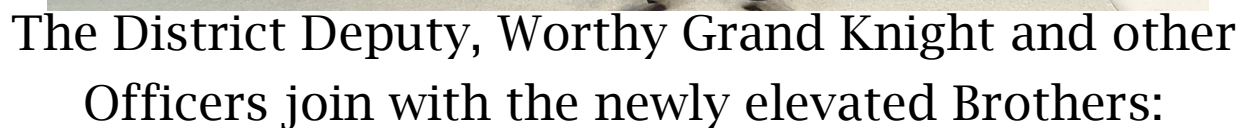

## SECTION 1: PURPOSE

The Knights of Columbus Council #6043 will be awarding one or more \$1,000 dollar scholarships to area high school seniors who plan on attending a college or university following graduation. These scholarships are intended to assist children and family of members of Council 6043 to offset the cost of higher education so that students can work to achieve their academic and career goals.

## SECTION 2: CRITERIA

Scholarships will be awarded to students based on the following criteria:

- The student must be enrolled in an accredited high school in the Tri-Valley community;
- The student must have a grade point average of 2.5 or better on a 4.0 scale;
- The student must submit the application and all required documentation by the stated deadline.
