Christmas and the end of the calendar year allow us to reflect on the past and the future. As a Chapter, you have accomplished a great deal in a few months.

* The August Mass and Installation Brunch was the largest attendance of the Chapter Installations in the State. Due to the success, next year's Installation is scheduled as a Mass and brunch on August 14th, 2015. This is the feast of Our Lady's Assumption. An honor for next year's officers to be installed on one of her feast days.

* The two training courses for FSs and GKs in October assisted you in better understanding our Orders technology and methods of handling membership.

* The amazing success of our Bishop's Vocation Dinner. The sold out 600 person crowd was pleasing to Bishop Barber. He asked we schedule another one next year (November 14th, 2015). * The World Games Special Olympics for July 2015 will be requesting coordinators in each Council for volunteer sign ups and event attendance. All events except opening and closing ceremonies are free. More details on this will be discussed at the January 17th Chapter Meeting.

* Catholic Charities of the East Bay(CCEB) is in need of a client van. At the June 2014 Chapter meeting, we were requested to raise funds for this effort. Councils have begun the donation process by simply writing Van Fund in the memo line.

* We are limited in Wheelchairs in the Diocese. As an example, there is the upcoming 4th Annual Charity Sporting Clay Shootout in Brother Ruben's District. Since \$300 buys 2 wheel chairs, it would be good to see every Council raise some funds for the wheelchair Mission. At the January Chapter meeting, Brother Lou Salvatore will speak about the wheelchair effort.

Since it is Christmas, a gift to every Council. When I attend a Council meeting for the first time, I will give the Grand Knight \$15: \$5 each for CCEB Van Fund, \$5 for Special Olympics and \$5 for the Council's Wheelchair effort.
