

A Note from our Worthy Chaplain, Pastor Fr. Mark Wiesner

Over the last two weekends I have preached at all our Masses about prayer. In this Advent season we are called to "prepare the way of the Lord." That call is not just for Christmas; it is for every day of our life. We are called to prepare the way for Christ to come into our life every day. Prayer is the way we do this.

The holy people I quoted above are inspirational for me and my prayer life. They are not talking about rosaries, scapulars, Masses and novenas, excellent as those all are. They are talking about personal time speaking with God from your heart about your life and being still and quiet to let Him speak back.

I once had a spiritual director who said to me, "If you think you're following Christ, but you don't have a prayer life, you're fooling yourself." I have discovered those words are true. There are no ifs, ands or buts. There is no way around it. People far holier and wiser than I make it clear; a regular prayer life is essential for those who would be true followers of Christ.

In the last two weeks, I have challenged all of us who come to Mass at the Catholic Community of Pleasanton to schedule ourselves to have 10 minutes of prayer every day of 2020, and to find someone who will check in with us to make sure we are not letting that time slip. As I mentioned, based on our average Sunday attendance, if we all prayed for 10 minutes a day that would be almost 463 hours of prayer rising from our community every day. 10 minutes is only 0.7% of each day. We can do this!

Chaplain's Note, Continued

We need to be a community of prayer as we discern and move forward with wherever God is calling us. If we are not, it is possible that any task we undertake, any direction we go, will rely on human wisdom and be subject to the desires of the all too often fickle human heart. I need your prayer. Our community needs your prayer. We need each other's prayer. As I mentioned in the homilies, it is not a matter of "Does God want to spend time with you? Does God want to be your friend?" Of course, he does! It's a matter of us choosing to spend time with God, of our choosing to be real friends with him.

As we move into 2020, the staff and I will regularly try to resource you with ways to pray, things to pray for, and will be checking in to see if you got "[#10inToday](#)." Schedule your 10 minutes each day today and ask someone to hold you accountable to it. If you have not had a regular prayer life, you will discover the more you pray, the easier it will become. Let us become a people of prayer...and let us keep each other in prayer. Have a blessed last few days of Advent.

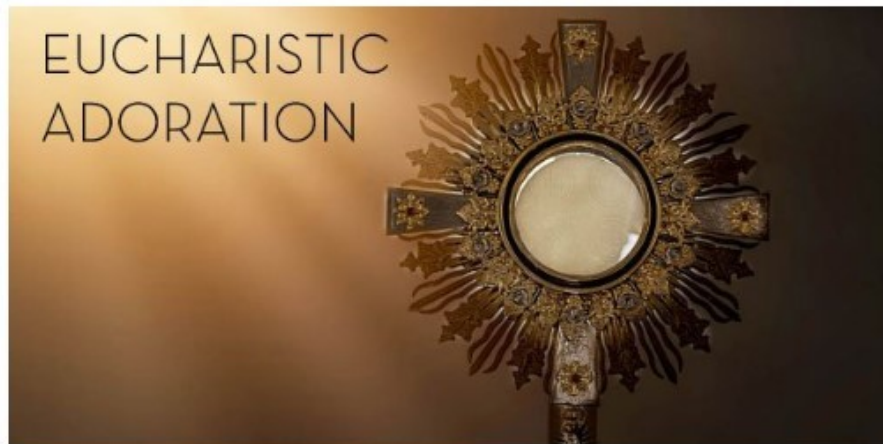

SECTION 1: PURPOSE

The Knights of Columbus Council #6043 will be awarding one or more \$1,000 dollar scholarships to area high school seniors who plan on attending a college or university following graduation. These scholarships are intended to assist children and family of members of Council 6043 to offset the cost of higher education so that students can work to achieve their academic and career goals.

SECTION 2: CRITERIA

Scholarships will be awarded to students based on the following criteria:

- The student must be enrolled in an accredited high school in the Tri-Valley community;
- The student must have a grade point average of 2.5 or better on a 4.0 scale;
- The student must submit the application and all required documentation by the stated deadline.
- Parent or Grandparent must be a current member in good standing with Council 6043

SECTION 3: REQUIRED DOCUMENTS & CHECKLIST

Completed submissions will contain the following four (4) documents:

1. A completed Knights of Columbus Council #6043 Application (this form) that is signed and submitted with the required documents (listed below);
2. In 250 words or less, please explain how this scholarship award will help you achieve your educational and career goals. Specifically, your essay should indicate what college or university you are planning to attend, what you plan to study, and what career path you have chosen.
3. One letter of recommendation from a teacher or school official (preferably on letterhead) that affirms your character.
4. A copy of your school transcript that shows your cumulative GPA (an unofficial copy is acceptable).

SECTION 4: DUE DATE & AWARD DISBURSEMENT

1. All scholarship materials must be submitted to the Grand Knight and postmarked or timestamped no later than 11:59 PM on April 30, 2020. Hardcopies can be mailed to: *K of C #6043*

2. All disbursements will be released to recipients after the council receives proof of enrollment.
3. If available, students will be honored at school awards ceremonies as well as at a Knights of Columbus council meeting with his or her parents (or guardians).
