My Brothers in Christ,

As we turn the page on another month, I'm deeply reflective of all the wonderful activities our Council has been apart during the past 8 months of this Columbian year. Regardless if the event seemed to be small or large in nature, attended by many or few, the underlying factor is that our Council and Community at large benefit greatly by our actions. Due to all of your unconditional and endless contributions to our core charity principle, I'm happy to report our annual Council Crab Feed / Silent Auction cornerstone event produced record revenues (11% over prior year), generated the highest net profits ever registered (14% over 2013) despite hosting the smallest crowd of the past decade (-12% from last year). I truly believe these outstanding figures are the results of everybody's tremendous planning, contributions & dedication. As reported earlier, all proceeds from this event goes to help local charities which provide food, clothing, shelter, medial, spiritual healing and care for the dying.

As March arrives, so does Ash Wednesday and the beginning of our 40-day annual Lent retreat to growing closer to God. The season of Lent gives all of us 40 days reflection of our spiritual lives and our relationship with God. It is a yearly opportunity to slow down, reflect and take stock on how we are living out our Baptismal commitment. Our Catholic tradition suggests we use the disciplines of prayer, fasting and almsgiving (good works) to renew our spiritual lives during Lent and await the arrival of Easter.

Also in March is our second (and last) First Degree that our Council puts on each Columbian Year. While our October ceremony generated 15 new active Council members, it is my prayer that our Council again will be able to duplicate that effort in welcoming more members in our March 13 First Degree, led by Brother Greg Jones and our First Degree Team. Our Worthy Chancellor/Membership Director, Sir Knight Paul Unpingco & our Worthy Deputy Grand Knight, SK Stephen Natale, will each be speaking at all the March 8 & 9 weekend mass' in pursuit of recruiting new members to our Order. I ask that all members support their efforts by wearing your Council shirts to the mass that you attend that weekend and assist with taking names and handing out informational pamphlets after each mass. To further assist with our efforts, the mass presider will introduce our speakers and we will also be advertising our Order and recruitment Blitz in the bulletin's back-page section.

There is nothing better than just asking a Catholic man or family to become part of our 'Strong Right Arm of the Church', as stated by Pope John Paul II. Again this year, we will be in charge of the Easter Vigil 'Holy Fire'; however, Fr. During one of my recent visits to our Sunday social, it was so special to see 4 year old Julia Powers (PGK Brad Schieferstein grand-daughter), with her presence, charm & grace, greeting and handing all our guests a napkin prior to their donut hunt.

I also recently visited a couple organizations that we supported via the Kevin Gourley Tootsie Roll campaign. Our Worthy Recorder and Chair of this event, Brother Dave Frankenberger, proudly presented our contribution to the CCOP SPRED ministry while PGK Mike Kliment did the same for the Diocese SPRED program; I visited the Pleasanton Unified Workability program and the Dublin School of Imagination & Happy Talkers. I was very touched by both organizations and the wonderful work that each

does. I was given a tour of the new Happy Talkers Dublin facilities by Co-Founder and Program Director Charlene Sigman. She shared with me the school programs of bringing out the extraordinary in every child through their family programs of educational, developmental and enrichment services. From her humble beginnings in 2001 (4 kids in her home), the 7 moves to keep program going and now serving over 350 children each week (ages 2 through kindergarten), their comprehensive programs not only help the children but also educate families and foster changing futures.

In closing, I want to again congratulate our 7 newest Sir Knights among our membership: Jeffrey Brent, Michael Egbujor, Dave Jones, Stephen Natale, Robert Strawn, Paul Unpingco and Mark Worrell. Congratulations on all your successful Crab Feeds. The five Councils in District #38 conducted six Crab Feeds...Dublin did a Friday and Saturday duo! Over \$100K of profits was generated through your efforts

The Fraternal survey has been completed. For calendar year 2013, the District performed 120,213 volunteer hours and gave \$175,952 to charitable causes. The Tri-Valley would not be an attractive place to live without the five Councils.

All the Councils have performed financial audits for the period of July 1, 2013 to December 31, 2013. After reviewing all the audit data, it is impressive how some Councils do so much with so little. The Knights of Columbus is an open organization regarding financials. If you have any thoughts or concerns, feel free to ask your Financial Secretary, Grand Knight, Trustees or the District Deputy.

In the last couple of weeks, we have had to deal with the death of Brothers. Ed Lafranchi of Livermore was a Brother for 56 years and a founding member of Council 4588. Sir Knight Jim Croker from San Ramon originally was in Dublin. Jim was known for working the Dublin Fish Fries. As only Jim would have wanted, he passed at the time of a fish fry. May perpetual shine upon their souls and all our departed Brothers.

Congratulations to the 37 new Sir Knights. The five tri-valley Councils produced the most Fourth Degree Knights at the exemplification. To begin preparation for next year's exemplification, Danville (April 12th) and Livermore (April 26th) will be hosting Second and Third Degrees. In one afternoon, you can complete both exemplifications. Pick one of these days and put it in your calendar.


