

- Enjoy our Council Information on the go


Do the following for an Android Phone:

From our Worthy Lecturer/Historian, Robert Federighi

St. John's Gospel is a mystical reflection on the Word Made Flesh, Jesus Christ. This theologically profound Gospel is composed by the beloved disciple John, who dined next to Jesus at the Last Supper. John's Gospel gives a fresh depiction of the life, passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus of Nazareth. The "hour" of his Passion expresses his Kingship and His triumphant road to glory. For example, the three predictions of his passion (3:14-15, 8:28, 12:31-33) are expressed by the verb ??ó? - to exalt or lift up. Remember that John was the only Apostle at the foot of the *Cross* with Mary. Jesus, when dying on the Cross, gave his Mother *Mary* to John (19:25-27).

The Gospel of John emphasizes the Incarnation and Divinity of <u>Jesus Christ</u>. The <u>Prologue</u> of John is a sublime piece of world literature! In the Prologue, John identifies Jesus as the **logos** - $\lambda \acute{o} \gamma o \varsigma$, the Word or reason, the philosophical concept of God's unifying principle for all of creation.

The Gospel of John calls Jesus the Messiah - $M\varepsilon\sigma\sigma i\alpha\varsigma$ - which means Christ or Anointed One

in 1:41 and 4:25. The Gospel is noteworthy for "I am" - $^{\prime}E\gamma\dot{\omega}$ $\epsilon\dot{\imath}\mu\dot{\imath}$ - sayings of Jesus that reveal his identity. In Exodus 3:14, God refers to himself as "I am who am." In the Gospel of John, Jesus identifies himself with God the Father: "Before Abraham came into being, I am" (8:58). The Gospel also relates seven "I am" sayings of Jesus associated with an image: 'I am the Bread of Life' (6:35), the 'Light of the World' (8:12), 'the Gate for the sheep' (10:7), the 'Good Shepherd' (10:11), the 'Resurrection and the Life' (11:25), the 'Way, the Truth, and the Life' (14:6), and the 'True Vine' (15:1).

Jesus in the Gospel reveals the mystery and relationships of the <u>Father</u>, the Son, and the Holy <u>Spirit</u>, called by the Church Fathers the Holy <u>Trinity</u>.

John in his writings particularly expresses the **love** God and his Son Jesus have for mankind - "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life" (John 3:16).

His Gospel is the only one which presents the miracle of the wedding feast at Cana, the discourse on the Bread of Life, the raising of Lazarus, the references to the living water and the Holy Spirit, the washing of the disciples' feet, the Prayer of Jesus, and his words to Mary and John at the Cross. John portrays Jesus in control of the events leading up to the Crucifixion, as events He must undergo to be obedient to his Father and save mankind.

The Sacraments of Baptism (Chapter 3) and Eucharist (Chapter 6) are unequivocally presented in the Gospel of John. The Gospel begins with John the Baptist calling Jesus the Lamb of God (1:29). Just as Moses in the Book of Exodus prescribed the sacrificial Lamb must be eaten for the first-born son to have life at the Passover, so we must partake of Jesus, the Lamb of God, at the Eucharistic Sacrifice to have eternal life.

St. John in his Gospel utilizes the word $\sigma \mu \epsilon \tilde{\nu} \nu$ - sign for the <u>Miracles</u> of Jesus Christ. The symbolic element of the miracle becomes primary in John. For example, in John 9, the interest in giving sight to the man born blind is not just the gift of sight, but in his coming to the spiritual insight of faith, an insight made possible by Jesus, the light of the world. The Gospel of John enumerates seven signs of Jesus: he turns water into wine at the wedding feast of Cana (2:1-12); the healing of an official's son in Capernaum (4:43-54); the healing of a paralytic on the sabbath by the pool in Bethesda (5:1-47); the feeding of the five thousand (6:1-14); walking on water (6:16-21); the healing of a man born blind (9:1-41); and the resurrection of Lazarus (11:1-57). John also records three appearances of Christ to his disciples following his Resurrection.



The sharp contrast between good and evil is portrayed in John's favorite imagery of light and darkness. In addition to light/darkness, opposites common to John to elicit theological themes are present throughout his writings, such as truth/lies, love/hate, life/death, and righteousness/sin. He refers to the son of perdition in John 17:12, calling him the antichrist in First John 2:18, 2:22, and 4:3 and Second John 1:7, and explicitly names him in Revelation 12:9.

In addition to his Gospel, the <u>First</u>, <u>Second</u>, and <u>Third</u> Letters of John and the Book of <u>Revelation</u> are traditionally attributed to the Beloved Disciple.

The Scripture is from the Authorized King James Version of the Holy Bible, now in the public domain, and the Revised Standard Version. King James I commissioned a group of Biblical scholars in 1604 to establish an authoritative translation of the Bible from the ancient languages and other translations at the time, and the work was completed in 1611. The original King James Bible included the Apocrypha but in a separate section. A literary masterpiece of the English language, the original King James Bible is still in use today.



40 Days For Life



Those of us who have participated in previous campaigns often have wondered if our presence and prayers at Planned Parenthood have been effective because more often than not we don't see the fruit of our labor.

The following true story occurred a few weeks ago. He is a 90 year old retired Navy sailor who discovered that his presence at a 40 Days For Life campaign saved a baby eight years ago! A woman was going in for an abortion and by all accounts she seemed to have completed it.

Then eight years later, she began sharing her story of how she couldn't go through with it because of the sight of "that little old man praying". She now has a beautiful little girl and was able to reunite with the man whose timely presence caused her to change her mind.

God only requires us to be faithful. We don't always see the fruit of our labor but sometimes we do. In the retired sailor's case he waited 8 years to find out that he was God's instrument. With the help of the Holy Spirit his prayerful presence changed her heart and was offered another chance to contemplate her choices.

Safe Environment Training for Council Members

A message to the Grand Knight from Lee Ann Harper, Office of Youth Protection, Manager, KofC Supreme

As a general matter, the Knights of Columbus expects that those participating in Knights of Columbus sponsored youth programs or activities on diocesan/parish property comply with diocesan safe environment policies. The Order's main concern is that knights cooperate with diocese and be compliant with the diocesan policies for volunteers using diocesan/parish property. We encourage our members to comply with applicable diocesan safe environment requirements when using parish/diocesan property.

If you discover that a knight is conducting a Knights sponsored youth program on diocesan/parish property without having completed applicable diocesan safe environment requirements, we would expect and understand that you would act to prohibit him from continued participation in our youth program on diocesan/parish property. For the Order, it is sufficient reason for a parish or diocese to prohibit a Knights sponsored youth program because the participating members leading the youth program have not complied with the diocesan requirements, even if they have completed the requirements of the Knights of Columbus Safe Environment Program.

The Knights of Columbus Safe Environment Program training and/or background screening is in addition to the diocesan requirements. We take seriously our obligation to ensure compliance with our Safe Environment Program. On a weekly basis we review member compliance and follow up directly with members and their grand knights when members are noncompliant. When members are noncompliant they are removed from their youth serving roles.

The Diocese of Oakland requires that all volunteers be trained to recognize and respond to the signs of abuse, to be informed of the reporting procedures and to learn how to safeguard the children and vulnerable adults in their care. Training is available thru VIRTUS and can be done on line or at a live training. Registration for either is mandatory. Trainings are available in Spanish and English. Check out the diocesan website for more information.

Bottom-line: we must follow the request of the Diocese and ALL VOLUNTEERS MUST take their training The knights training is in addition to the diocesan requirements.

The parish website includes a page on the training

The information on that page seems to cover most of the information on the comparable page for the Diocese [https://www.oakdiocese.org/offices/safe-environment/safe-environment-and-victims-assistance?searchterm=safe+environment+training]. The Diocese page does include access to locations scheduled for live training.

State Deputies, grand knights, and faithful navigators (if their assemblies sponsor a Columbian Squires Circle) are required to complete Praesidium's Armatus© youth protection training to help ensure that they understand the policies and procedures that members of the Knights of Columbus are expected to follow regarding the safety and well-being of young people served through the Order's programs and activities.



Update Your Beneficiaries

Sometimes it is easy to overlook the simplest of things.

Take, for example, the beneficiaries on your life insurance policies. If your policy was applied for and issued several years ago, it may very well be that the person you originally selected as the beneficiary is no longer the person you would want to receive the policy proceeds. If you bought the policy when you were single, for example, you may have named your parents as beneficiaries. If you have since married, your policies should be updated to reflect your spouse as beneficiary. Maybe you've had children since, who are not named on the policies.

Most people list a primary beneficiary, who is specifically designated as the first in priority to receive policy proceeds. We also encourage the naming of a contingent beneficiary, an alternate person designated to receive policy proceeds, usually in the event that the original beneficiary pre-deceases the insured.

I routinely call all of my policyholders for annual review appointments, usually near the anniversary date of your policy – that is, the date it was originally issued. One of the matters that I'll discuss during this review is the status of your beneficiary designations. If they need updating, and they often do, I can complete the paperwork during that appointment.

I look forward to meeting with each of you to discuss your family's needs.
