

A Note from Fr. Mark

Something's not right.

Last week, when I returned from my time away, I received a handwritten note from a visitor to our community, who wrote:

I was recently visiting Pleasanton to see my daughter and spent quite a bit of time at St. Augustine's. The parish is great – music was great on Sunday, homilies were great, Fr. Chris was great in confession. I was amazed that at 10:00 a.m. Mass that church wasn't full. I pray for the church every day.

Something's not right.

Next month is October (already!). Every year the Diocese has every parish in the diocese count attendance at all Masses. This is one important indicator of the health of the Church in the Diocese of Oakland, as well as in our local parish. The October count numbers for our parish are both interesting and concerning.

In 2000, the year the church at St. Elizabeth Seton opened, our October count was 3371.

Our October count reached was at its highest in 2012, with a count of 4492.

Since then, every year has shown a decline in attendance.

In October of 2015 our count was 4030.

One year later, In October of 2016 our attendance plummeted to 2868.

Last year, 2018, we had our lowest attendance since 1993. Our count was 2799.

As you might expect, along with the drop in attendance, participation in other aspects of parish life (the number of baptisms, first communions, confirmations and children in Faith Formation among others) has declined as well.

While it is true most churches in our Diocese and the country are experiencing a decline in attendance, ours is particularly pronounced and disturbing.

I have shared most of this information with Pastoral Council, Finance Council and the Parish Staff. We have begun preliminary discussions reading causes of this decline and how we might address it. There will be no easy fixes and no easy answers. I have found myself saying to many people that the next three to five years here at CCOP will be very interesting and very determinative of what our future as the Catholic church in Pleasanton will be like.

Somethings not right

At this time I ask for nothing but your earnest and genuine prayer for the leadership bodies of our parish as we study the issues at hand, set goals for our future and strategies to accomplish them. Currently we are reading a book entitled "Divine Renovation", by Fr. John Mallon. Last October Bishop Barber brought Fr. Mallon to our Diocese to speak with parish staffs about the very issues we are facing. However, eventually any resolution will involve every one of us who calls CCOP home.

Something's not right,

but by our faith filled action and power of God new life will be found.

God is Faithful!

Our Lady of the Rosary, Feast Day October 7.

According to Dominican tradition, in 1206, <u>St. Dominic</u> was in <u>Prouille</u>, France, attempting to convert the <u>Albigensians</u> back to the Catholic Faith. The young priest had little success until one day he received a vision of the Blessed Virgin, who gave him the Rosary as a tool against <u>heretics</u>. While Mary giving the rosary to St. Dominic is generally acknowledged as a legend, the development of this prayer form owes much to the followers of St. Dominic.

I, and I'm sure you also, have many tools to complete simple "fix it" chores around the house. Without these simple but necessary tools my fix it job would be difficult to accomplish and maybe aggravating or frustrating. I had to learn how to use the tool properly and confidently. Through practice I feel more independent with that knowledge and am confident that I can complete most jobs.

This comparison of tools and Rosaries place my Catholic Faith on a parallel plain. I have to think about what I'm trying to accomplish. Maybe use my computer to research my mission. I reflect and rely on my instincts and build confidence that the job will be completed.

The Rosary, I found, is the best tool in my toolbox. I rely on reflection, assurances, and mission. I learned to communicate on a higher plane and TRUST in the outcome. The job may be simple, like praying for a loved one in distress, or a complex one such as, praying for someone in desperate need of a miracle. Both are equally important in God's eyes. I reflect on the Life of Jesus and His Church. I'm assured of Christ's promise that, "I will be with you until the end of time." I'm amazed at a mission accomplished all through God's Will. Finally, I rely on our Heavenly Mother, "Our Lady of the Rosary," to deliver my petitions to Her Son for me. She will not be denied by our Loving God...... Our Lady of the Rosary pray for us!

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS

DISTRICT DEPUTY #43

In 2009, by the end of October our district had 48 new first-degree Knights, 50 new second-degree Knights, and 91 new third-degree Knights. That noteworthy achievement was the best in the state.

Today, we only have 20 new knights and 4 each for second and third-degrees. Where is the old spirit of evangelization that encouraged men to join our fraternity and advance through the degrees?

Most Knights think membership is someone else's job. That's why we are so bad at it. One guy cannot run an effective membership program. The most successful councils make recruitment an "All Hands" event. Recruiting en masse shows men that they are joining something hugely significant. It shows them that many good Catholic men share their values. When you only have one or two recruiters standing outside of church, many folks don't even notice.

When your council runs its upcoming membership drive, you should drop what you are doing and help. And I don't mean that you should just go to your regular mass and grin at people. I mean that you should go early and stay late. I mean that you should stay for two or more masses. I mean that you should bring your friends and neighbors to the recruitment table and sell them on why it's great to be a Knight. You should feel personally obligated to get at least one form 100 signed!

Our ability to support the church and community stems directly from our strength in numbers. Every year we lose good men due to ageing, death, illness, etc. We not only have to replace those losses; we also must increase the total so we can be responsive to the growing needs for charitable works.

I'd like to squash a concept that I hear in every council when men say that they only want to recruit "Quality Members". They don't want to chase down Knights in following years to pay their dues and get involved. No matter how well intentioned, this is not a policy condoned by our fraternal order.

Our mandate from the Supreme Knight is to "Give all Catholic Men the opportunity to live their faith in actions of service". The word "Quality" is not a part of that goal. It is okay for men to join and get cold feet. Or to join and then decide they weren't ready for a commitment. Or to join and have life's circumstances pull them in other directions. We should thank them for trying. We should encourage them to stay involved on the fringes and to come back when their lives permit, or their hearts compel.

Don't worry about carrying "dead weight" on your rosters. Striving to clean up the roster is a misplaced use of your talent. Some changes are afoot that will make that a moot concern. It won't be an issue much longer.

Be an evangelist for the Knights! Our Church needs us today more than ever. Please support the Church by getting more men to rally to her aid as Knights.

Urge a Veto of the Bill that Requires Medicated Abortions be Available on Campus

VETO SB 24

SB 24, Abortion by medication bill, (Leyva, D-Chino) mandates that on-campus health centers at public universities in California offer abortion-inducing drugs like RU-486. Governor Brown vetoed a similar bill (SB 320) last year.

SB 24 also invites health centers to offer abortion-counseling services to students but is specifically written in such a way to exclude pro-life counseling. This bill fails to allow students the opportunity to know any option other than abortion.

Besides the moral significance of this bill, SB 24 puts the health of college women at risk because college health centers will not have adequate resources to support them as they should. The bill also requires the state's Commission on the Status of Women and Girls to accept donations and administer an abortion promotion fund. The state of California should not be encouraging or funding abortions at all.

Let the Governor know that you oppose this one-sided bill. Where is the assistance for women who want to choose to keep their babies?

Ask Governor Newsome to VETO SB 24.

40 Days For Life

Those of us who have participated in previous campaigns often have wondered if our presence and prayers at Planned Parenthood have been effective because more often than not we don't see the fruit of our labor. God only requires us to be faithful. Success often escapes or appears at another time when we don't expect it.

The following true story occurred a little more than a year ago. He is a 91 rear old retired Navy sailor who discovered that his presence at a 40 Days for Life campaign saved a baby nine years ago! A woman was going in for an abortion at a Planned Parenthood clinic while he was standing in front of the clinic praying. Time passed slowly and she came out and drove away.

Then eight years later, she began sharing her story of how she couldn't go through with the abortion because of the sight of "that little old man praying" outside. She now has a beautiful little girl and was able to eunite with the man whose timely presence cause her to change her mind.

God only requires us to be faithful. We don't always see the fruit of our abor but sometimes we do. In the retired sailor's case he waited 8 years to find out that he was God's instrument. With the help of the Holy Spirit, his prayerful presence changed her heart and she decided to carry her paby to full term.

This Fall campaign runs from **Sept.25 to Nov.3** excluding Sundays and starts at 7:00 AM through 7:00 PM. The location is the sidewalk outside of Planned Parenthood in Walnut Creek, two blocks from St Mary's Catholic Church.
