### God is Faithful!

As I write this we come upon the Feasts of (8/27) Saint Monica, Born 322 died in 387 and (8/28) Saint Augustine Born November 13, 354 died August 28,430. I will always be enamored by the tenacity and persistence of St. Monica's prayer life and devotion. In the end she not only brought her husband to the faith on his death bed, but also brought her son Augustine up to being a Doctor of the church ( Doctor of Grace).

Some of His famous sayings are "Conquer yourself and the world lies at your feet." and "Our Hearts are made for You, O Lord, and they are restless until they rest in You". These words resonate even in today's environment. As Catholic Gentlemen we have the opportunity to reflect in these and other Saints for spiritual direction on how we continue to raise our children, grand-children and maybe great grand-children.

This past week with the extremely hot weather I experienced at Saint Monica Church in Moraga, as I am the maintenance manager, two, over 40 year old trees split and fell to the ground. The Arborist explained that when 101 degree temperatures hit the top of the trees, the trunk will release all of its moisture to the branches for their survival. In reality the spent trunk could not hold the weight of the enormous branches. This experience had me ponder the balance of nature and the balance of my faith. I too need to take care of myself, then help in any way, those whom we love and support. I learned to pray more like St. Monica and let God support my family, like He did for Saint Augustine, somewhat like the trunk will support the branches. Let's also offer a prayer for Our New Pastor Father Mark on His Mission and Vision for this community of Faith.

I'd like to devote this newsletter to time. More specifically our perception of how much time we have and how we are willing (or not) to use it.

I just attended a parish membership drive where the pastor gave an awesome sermon exhorting everyone to go out there and live their faith by showing the world what it means to be Christians. Not just by words but, more importantly, by deeds. Everyone received the message loud and clear. What a great lead-in to our recruitment drive!

Amazingly, everyone shifted gears as they left the church. They left that valuable lesson within the church walls. When we offered men the opportunity to do exactly what Father encouraged, they said "I don't have time" or "Not now, maybe later". Or they ignored and avoided us. But we're the good guys trying to help them be better men and better Catholics! Why such a disconnect? Why is everyone so quick to throw up the time excuse?

Here's another example. You all know what a major commitment it is for a man to be Grand Knight. A lot of work goes into organizing the entire year so that everything will run smoothly. A critical element is forming a cohesive team of officers and directors for the operations and programs. Sadly, I've noted that, on average, two officers / directors quit within two months because they don't have time. I won't judge their reasons. However, I will mention the negative, impact they have on the councils.

When a leader quits or fails to perform his committed duties, those duties get dumped on the already overburdened Grand Knight, or they just don't get done at all and the council or parish suffers. As men of faith and action, we should not let such things happen. When a vacancy appears, please man up and volunteer to fill it. When you commit to a duty, please see it through to the end.

Some men truly don't have time. One brother has a large family. His job requires travel. One of his children is dying. He is stressed to limits that most men cannot even imagine. This man doesn't have time to lead a council program. Yet, he continues to support his council by his presence and participation, along with his family members. What an example of selfless faith in action! This man gets it.

I signed up for a council program called Exodus 90. It involves removing all unnecessary time commitments from your daily life. It also demands the removal of many unhealthy habits like consumption of alcohol and sweets. I've been preparing myself for several months by seeing how hard it would be to give up certain things like TV, movies, ball games and dessert. It was enlightening to see how much time is drained by these seemingly normal habits and how much energy is wasted on them.

When you pull on the "I don't have time" string, it is amazing what you find at the other end. I've heard men say they can't do Exodus 90 because they aren't willing to give up watching the Warriors games, playing Saturday golf games, watching their favorite TV shows, or spending time on Facebook and Twitter. Or they can't give up their weekly wine tasting or movie date. Some of these men are the same ones who won't step up to council leadership positions because they don't have time.

# 40 Days For Life

Those of us who have participated in previous campaigns often have wondered if our presence and prayers at Planned Parenthood have been effective because more often than not we don't see the fruit of our labor. God only requires us to be faithful. Success often escapes or appears at another time when we don't expect it.

The following true story occurred a little more than a year ago. He is a 91 rear old retired Navy sailor who discovered that his presence at a 40 Days for Life campaign saved a baby nine years ago! A woman was going in for an abortion at a Planned Parenthood clinic while he was standing in front of the clinic praying. Time passed slowly and she came out and drove away.

Then eight years later, she began sharing her story of how she couldn't go through with the abortion because of the sight of "that little old man praying" outside. She now has a beautiful little girl and was able to eunite with the man whose timely presence cause her to change her mind.

God only requires us to be faithful. We don't always see the fruit of our abor but sometimes we do. In the retired sailor's case he waited 8 years to find out that he was God's instrument. With the help of the Holy Spirit, his prayerful presence changed her heart and she decided to carry her paby to full term.

This Fall campaign runs from **Sept.25 to Nov.3** excluding Sundays and starts at 7:00 AM through 7:00 PM. The location is the sidewalk outside of Planned Parenthood in Walnut Creek, two blocks from St Mary's Catholic Church. Founded over 20 years ago by a Catholic psychotherapist from Philadelphia, *Rachel's Vineyard* is a post-abortion healing retreat flourishing in the United States and now expanding internationally. Monika Rodman Montanaro for 12 years led Rachel's Vineyard retreats for the Diocese of Oakland, CA. After moving to Italy in 2007, she and her Italian husband, together with other Italian volunteers, in 2010 launched the retreats in Italy.

<u>This pioneering ministry is Italy's first-ever</u> Catholic outreach to women, men and couples seeking to reconcile their hidden grief associated with past abortion experiences. Our work embodies the New Evangelization so desperately needed in what is rapidly becoming a "post-Christian" Europe. During the *Year of Mercy* and beyond, Pope Francis has emphasized that the Church must expand its post-abortion pastoral care. The Italy Mission is doing precisely this - at the heart of the Church!

Women and men from Sicily to Piemonte travel hundreds of kilometers to Bologna to participate in this one-of-a kind 3-day program. While the *Rachel's Vineyard Italy Mission* has attracted the attention of the Italian Bishops Conference and the blessing of Cardinal Renato Martino, Cardinal Carlo Caffarra, and Cardinal Elio Sgreccia, financially the ministry is not yet self-supporting and thus remains largely a Mission of U.S. Catholics.

American Catholics who've already partnered in this ground-breaking project include mission-minded, pro-life individuals, Knights of Columbus Councils and, in the last 3 years, the Diocese of San Diego Missions Office. We invite you to join us!




