Pastor's Corner

What a beginning to a New Year! Fr. Jerry Kennedy died suddenly of a heart attack on January 2nd. What a loss to our Church, our Diocese and our Parish. The sudden death of Fr. Jerry is a painful loss in my life since he was one of my best friends. We had planned to meet for dinner on Friday, January 4. He was enjoying the banquet table in eternity and I am sure already into telling stories.

Since his death so many people have been sharing their experiences of Fr. Jerry at Parish meetings, on Face Book, and emails to me. We have suffered a great loss. Though he was with us a very short while at CCOP, Fr. Jerry shared his pastoral heart with us very conscientiously and generously. As a Parish, we grieve his sudden passing. It is true, we only grieve over those we love.

Fr. Jerry came from a very large family. His dad was a doctor and his mom a nurse. Within that family his vocation was nurtured. Fr. Jerry was truly a product of his loving environment. It was in that sacred shelter of faith, hope and love that Fr Jerry was prepared to say "Yes" to God in his call to Priesthood. He continued to honor that Yes in a wholehearted way as a priest for over 46 years.

Fr. Jerry loved to share with us about being a kid and coming to Pleasanton with his family to visit. His father had friends that lived in Pleasanton and he always mused at how long it took for them to get to Pleasanton. It is very significant that Fr. Jerry spent the last three years of his active priestly story in our Parish.

Fr. Jerry enjoyed both his diocesan and priestly assignments, yet he always said that the best part of being a priest has been the people he met over the years. Fr. Jerry was a people priest. For Jerry, imbued by the fire of Vatican II, the Church has been the people of God. While with us he was in awe as he witnessed the development of so many ministries and so

Fr. Jerry could not wait to retire. He always said that he had been so blessed to be a priest during the years when the teaching of Vatican II was unfolding in the Diocese under the leadership of Bishop John Cummins, his dear friend. He was also quite sad when we would see traces of the seeds of triumphalism, juridicism and clericalism begin to grow again in certain areas of the Church.

Fr. Jerry was a priest who PLEASED GOD AND LOVED PEOPLE in very simple but profound ways. It was the little things were the big things: thank you cards, birthday remembrances, small gifts from vacation, homilies in touch with the real world, love for the poor, a listening ear, encouraging words, keeping in touch with couples he married and with families whose loved ones he buried.

As I sat down with his family to prepare for his funeral liturgy, I will remember these words and they made total sense when I reflected on Fr. Jerry's priesthood in CCOP. There was no room for selfishness in our family. There was no room for selfishness in the priesthood of Fr. Jerry. He picked up that core value in his home. Yes, religion is caught not taught. The presence of God was part of every aspect of his growing up in a large family. That's what WE remember here at CCOP.

Here are some words from parishioners grieving his death:
"Always so sincere and warm; may his spirit live on in the hearts of those who ministered with him here with so much kindness and compassion; he had a joyful spirit, one morning an altar server fainted, he was so concerned about her daughter that he called that evening to check and see how she was doing. I will always remember him with that smile and gentle spirit, a wonderful caring priest, such a kind soul; we will miss the jokes and mentoring of our faith."

Fr. Jerry died during the Christmas season — how significant! Fr. Jerry was a place where people found Christ. That is the core of Catholic Priesthood. And we were blessed to have known him and been a part of his Priestly journey.

Ecce Sacerdos – Behold a great priest who in his life pleased God and loved people. Jerry, we will miss you more than you can ever imagine. Rest in peace.

"Have you considered joining the 4th Degree"

Brothers,

For most men who follow Jesus, there comes a time when duty extends beyond our own lives, beyond how we lead our families and into how we serve our fellow man. That's what the Knights of Columbus is all about. The Patriotic Degree allows K of C members to take this duty one step further.

The primary purpose of the Fourth Degree is to foster the spirit of patriotism by promoting responsible citizenship and a love of and loyalty to the Knights' respective countries through active membership in local Fourth Degree groups called Assemblies. Fourth degree members are called "Sir Knight" which is more than a title – it's an honor.

Have you considered joining the 4th Degree? You see the Fourth degree most frequently as the Color Corps, which wears uniforms modeled after the French Navy of the 18th Century, with capes, Chapeaus (the feathered hats) and swords. Not every 4th degree knight joins the Color Corps, but all 4th degree wear tuxedos for our formal events. In our area, Fourth Degree members are active participants in the East Bay Stand Down (a county wide event for homeless veterans) and the host for the annual Red, Blue and Gold Dinner which honors the efforts of local fire fighters and police officers.


This is your invitation to join the Holy Spirit Assembly 1979 which is comprised of knights from all of the five Tri-Valley Councils.

10 TIPS FOR FAMILY CAREGIVERS

- **1** Caregiving is a job and respite is your earned right. **Reward yourself** with respite breaks often.
- 2 Watch out for signs of depression, and don't delay in getting professional help when you need it.
- **3** When people offer to help, **accept the offer** and suggest specific things they can do.
- 4 Educate yourself about your loved one's condition and how to communicate effectively with doctors.
- 5 There's a difference between caring and doing. Be open to technologies and ideas that promote your loved one's independence.
- **6** Trust your instincts. Most of the time they'll lead you in the right direction
- **7** Caregivers often do a lot of lifting, pushing, and pulling. **Be good to your back**.
- 8 Grieve for your losses, and then allow yourself to dream new dreams.
- 9 Seek support from other caregivers. There is great strength in knowing you are not alone.
- 10 Stand up for your rights as a caregiver and a citizen.
